

NCPCM Heating Fuels Committee
Heating Oil Appliance Installation Rebate Program Rules
Appliance Rebate shall be approved before the purchase/installation of the fuel oil equipment.

Eligibility:

A. NCPCM Members (Pre-approval is required)

Only North Carolina Fuel Oil Dealers who are members of the North Carolina Petroleum & Convenience Marketers are eligible to participate. **The program is not available to the public except through a NCPCM member.** The NCPCM Member is responsible for documenting that an eligible installation has been performed, that all eligible appliances are new and have been identified.

REBATE CHECKS ARE ONLY PAYABLE TO NCPCM MEMBERS

NCPCM Members are responsible for submitting the following to NCPCM:

1. Completed 2011/12 NCPCM Rebate Form.
2. Appliance Invoice Receipt.

B. Applicant

The applicant is described as a consumer (owner of the residence or business where the appliance is installed). Applicants must receive a rebate through a participating NCPCM Member and must agree to the regulations and conditions on the application form. The applicant must sign the application.

C. Eligible Installation of Water Heaters/Boilers

The program authorizes a \$250.00 rebate for the safe installation of a new, approved, fuel oil-fueled conventional water heater or boiler in a new residential or commercial building or to replace any existing water heater/boiler in a residential or commercial building. The safe installation must take place on real property located in North Carolina or within the trade territory normally served by the participating NCPCM Member location. Approved water heaters/boilers are defined as a fuel oil-dedicated fueled water heater or boiler. The eligible applicant must be in good standing with the participating NCPCM Member.

D. Eligible Installation of Oil Pack/Furnaces-Central Heating System

The program authorizes a \$250.00 rebate for the safe installation of a new authorized fuel oil fueled, ducted, central heating system in a new, residential or commercial building or to replace any existing ducted, central heating system in residential or commercial building. The above referenced system must be the primary source of heat in a primary residence. The safe installation must take place on real property located in North Carolina or within the trade territory normally served by the participating NCPCM member location. The eligible applicant must be in good standing with the NCPCM Member.

E. Limits

No More than fifteen (15) installation rebates to any single NCPCM Member Firm.

No more than two (2) installation rebates will be paid per residence or business (profit or non-profit). The North Carolina Petroleum & Convenience Marketers may limit the total number of rebates paid to an applicant. NCPCM Heating Fuels Committee reserves the right to change the terms and conditions at any time to safeguard original intent of the appliance installation rebate program.

F. NCPCM Staff Approval of Rebate Forms

NCPCM staff will approve each application individually. Data missing on an application may delay or disqualify the application. False or misleading information may disqualify an applicant or suspend a NCPCM Member from the program. Within thirty (30) days after the NCPCM suspends or declares an applicant or NCPCM member ineligible, they may appeal the action by submitting the appeal in writing to the NCPCM at 7300 Glenwood Avenue, Raleigh, N.C. 27612. Attention Mr. Gary Harris. Actions taken by the NCPCM Heating Fuels Committee with respect to such appeals will be final.

G. Verification

A site inspection, conducted by or on behalf of the NCPCM Member, must be conducted prior to the submission of any rebate application. An appropriate inspection consists of an on-site inspection, review & documentation of Building Code Installation Permit, for the purpose of verifying that the heating oil equipment system, including all equipment is or was installed in compliance with the North Carolina Building Code and/or NFPA 31 and is in safe operating condition. Only new appliances are eligible for rebates and a paid invoice must accompany the application. NCPCM staff may choose to spot check random installations for quality control of program.

H. Applications

To apply for the rebate, the application must be made on the form provided by the NCPCM Heating Fuels Committee. All requested information must be provided along with the necessary documentation. To start the rebate program, an applicant needs to contact an authorized NCPCM Member to obtain a rebate application. The NCPCM Member offers their company's services in replacing the water heater, furnace or oil pack (if available) or makes suggestions for purchases and installations from license/certified HVAC/Plumbers contractors. Purchase location preferences are up to the applicant. This rebate is not affiliated with any other HVAC rebate programs.

I. Rebate Payment to NCPCM Members ONLY

The applicant must obtain an installation document and inspection detailing each installation to accompany the application. The NCPCM Member must mail or email the installation documents and inspection to the NCPCM, 7300 Glenwood Avenue, Raleigh, N.C., 27612, <mailto:tloughlin@ncpcm.org>; within thirty (30) days of the date of the inspection. Allow 6-8 weeks for receipt of the rebate check. The expiration of the rebate program is March 1, 2012 or while funds are available. Limit time offer.

The NCPCM member shall confirm with NCPCM staff that funds are available before starting the installation process. Appliance Rebate shall be approved before the purchase/installation of the fuel oil equipment.
